### Airbus Takes Final Step to End Long Standing WTO Dispute and US Tariffs

See the most recent update on the long standing [WTO dispute](#) where the French and Spanish governments have agreed with Airbus to make changes to the launch investment contracts that were part of the underlying dispute between the U.S and EU. While the [EU](#) has called for the U.S. to eliminate the Section 301 tariffs as the EU believes these changes remove the grounds for the tariffs, the WTO will need to review these changes and determine if these actions bring the EU into compliance with the WTO obligations. Alternatively, the EU and the U.S. could entered into an agreement that these actions bring the EU into compliance with WTO obligations. At this time, the U.S. government has not responded to these announcements.

We will continue to monitor this very closely, especially as USTR is expected to announce potential changes to the rate of duty and list of good subject to the Section 301 tariffs due to this dispute on or around August 12, 2020.

#### Dates to Remember

##### **August 31, 2020**

Last day to enter dairy products into U.S. Customs territory that may be used to qualify and establish eligibility for a calendar year 2021 license.

\* If a deadline date falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or Federal holiday, the deadline will be the next business day (Section 6.36(a) of the Dairy Tariff-Rate Import Quota Licensing Regulation). This does not apply to dates of entry for eligibility.
